open science schooling granted

The 30 months Erasmus+ project OPEN SCIENCE SCHOOLING was granted in June 2017.

The project will experiment with new open science didactics in secondary schools from across Europe - to create useful guidance for schools on how to innovate science learning and re-engage young students in science and science learning.

Erasmus+ 2018 coming up...

We start the new Erasmus+ initiatives for the 2018 Call from October. As our Erasmus+ success rate is 60% we are confident to develop new projects, at the same time avoiding the most problematic National Agencies.

Some of the top priority topics for the new applications will be: *entrepreneurship* in education, audio-visual guidance for families and care-takers responsible for people with *dementia* and *radicalisation* prevention in schools and beyond. *Interested*?



iCAP granted

The Erasmus+ iCAP project was granted in August in the UK. iCAP is one of the first practice-oriented projects in the EU responding to the Commission's recent invitations to establish experimentation with the creation of innovation interest, skills and capacity in primary and secondary school, and it also contributes to a new generation of Erasmus responding to the increasing EU interest in entrepreneurship and innovation based schooling.

PRIDE granted

The **PRIDE** project (Erasmus+ Youth) - Prevent Radicalisation through Identity Development - was granted April 2017. The project will develop innovative tools to prevent **radicalisation** among young migrants. PRIDE thus tackles the threat of radicalisation among young migrants and empowers them to manage the process of migration in a purposeful and positive way.
