erasmus+ Third Europe granted



The project duration is 30 months and the partner countries involved are from: United Kingdom, Spain, Croatia, Austria and Belgium.



erasmus+ CHRIS granted


The Erasmus+ CHRIS project was granted in July. The project will develop innovative and youth-driven strategies to counter radicalisation in school. The project is coordinated by University College Zealand in Denmark. The project is expected to be followed by the CHRIS Community project.



erasmus+ iYouth granted

iYouth - Empowering Europe's Young Innovators - the desire to innovate!


The iYouth project forms part of the Commission's Empowering European's Young Innovators Agenda through its contributions to the exploration of how to, in practice, **foster innovation interest** among young people.





erasmus+ Sport Entrepreneur granted

The project will aim to create **sport entreprenruial capacity** building for youth workers and young sport entrepreneurs in 7 very different countries and through a capacity building model inspired by 21st century didactics and powerful capacity building mechanisms in virtual gaming.



the erasmus+ Senior Social Entrepreneuring granted

The project will create capacity among experienced seniors to drive bottom-up social innovation in their communities, and with a strong view to create cross-sector partnerships to accomplish such missions. The project is coordinated by the City of Aarhus.



ScienceGirls granted

ScienceGirls coordinated by Furness UK aims to contribute to the Science Learning Innovation Agenda through practical experimentation in secondary school, and guided by Commission recommendation and by guidelines from leading science learning research communities. The project aims impact on science learning in schools re-defining it's to appeal to the young generations.
